With principal investigators Professor Sonia Livingstone and Jasmina Byrne, Global Kids Online is a collaboration between the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE), the UNICEF Office of Research-Innocenti, and the EU Kids Online network.

The research toolkit includes:

- **Quantitative tools:** a modular survey for children aged 9 to 17 and their parents.
- Qualitative tools: materials needed for conducting and analysing individual interviews and focus groups with children.
- Method guides: expert guidance and practical research advice on key issues.
- Adapting the tools: resources for adapting the tools to different contexts.
- **Impact tools:** resources that help you to work effectively with key stakeholders.
